

# Corporation Learning Style Presented At Principals' Meeting By KHS Students

Kearny High School Principal Frank Digesere, along with physics teacher, John O'Hara, and high school students, Marcee Martinez, Jonathan Aparicio, and Jennifer Gawronski, presented at the Hudson County Principals' Association meeting at Memorial High School, in West New York.

Digesere is the president of the association and invited O'Hara and his students to present Corporation Learning to the members.

During the meeting, O'Hara spoke on how the Corporation Learning process could be used by other high schools in the county, especially schools on block scheduling. Corporation Learning is a new and unique style of learning where the students work as a corporation to enhance their learning abilities. The process was introduced into the Kearny School District six years ago.

oped to provide students with the life skills they will need in the 21st century. After O'Hara's presentation, Martinez and Gawronski out-

lined the process and the requirements in depth and demonstrated how this process could be incorporated into any junior or

senior high school in any subject area such as mathematics, English, and the arts. Aparicio presented the corporate web sites and newsletters that are created by the teams of Corporation Physics.

The meeting concluded with a videotape of Corporation Physics presentation of the process being used in Kearny High School and in a physics class in South Brunswick High School. O'Hara did a faculty-training workshop at the high school in October and physics teacher Mike Gillen introduced the process to his students. O'Hara and Gillen plan to bring students to each school to meet and share their thoughts about Corporation Physics.

Other area high schools are using the process in other subject areas. Administrators from Kearny, Hoboken, Jersey City, Bayonne, and West New York school districts attended the meeting.
